

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Easter - Alive Again!

Mary Magdalene, according to the Biblical account of Easter, was the first person to see the resurrected Jesus. But first she faced the enormous grief of his death, and early on Easter morning the bewildering shock of the empty tomb.

Then Mary ran and came to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him."

Mary Magdalene was a changed woman. The Gospel of Luke tells us that Jesus cast seven demons out of Mary. Mary's deliverance is the catalyst which makes her sign up with the Jesus movement. For three years or so Mary was part of Jesus' following.

Going to the tomb on Easter morning was a human thing, a matter of devotion and caring. But Marys devotion was turned to something completely different by meeting Jesus in the garden.

Mary turned around and saw Jesus standing there, and did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" She, supposing Him to be the gardener, said to Him, "Sir, if You have carried Him away, tell me where You have laid Him, and I will take Him away."

Jesus said to her, "Mary!" (John 20:14-16)

This is revelation. A moment of truth. Here is the risen Lord. Jesus died, and rose again. No man has ever done this - a dead man cannot rise. But Jesus did, and this power, this supernatural life is the source of our Christian faith, our community, our life together in Witham as Bethel Christian Fellowship.

Paul the Apostle wrote in the letter to the Phillippians, "That I might know him, and the power of his resurrection." He says he counts all his achievements as loss, to just know Jesus, in this way.

Knowing Him. Mary Magdalene knew Jesus personally. Paul knew him as his Lord and Saviour, I know him as the Living Christ, today, whose Love reaches out to me in so many different ways. By His grace! The living Christ can say to you, "Your sins are forgiven you." He is able now to breathe into vou eternal life. I grew up an atheist in an atheist family. I didn't become a born again Christian until I was 25. remember wrestling with the problem of living one short life, dying and then being gone for eternity. Why?! What is the point? Torment! Then at age 16 I had an experience of God which was a physical encounter, I felt like I had been plugged into a light socket, a rush of joy maybe, but after that I just continued on with my unbelieving life for 9 more years. No church. No godly life. A normal teenage life. was not born again but I had started on the way to follow. God was calling. Did I believe in Jesus? Yes! But so does the devil (and he trembles, James 2:19).

The encouraging thing is that once you are on the way, nothing can knock you off the way (Isa 25:8, Psa 26). Even if you are foolish, you can stay on the way and not fall!

Once you are persuaded, the next step is to believe (the Truth) and to put your faith in him (the Life). Faith as a verb, not a noun. When I was 16 I was persuaded Jesus was real but had no relationship with him. To believe is to put your trust in someone or something. To believe in Jesus must mean that you believe what he says in the Bible, and if you believe what he says then you need to obey what he says.

How do you put your trust in him? When we hear his voice, we have to respond somehow. Praying for someone else is an act of faith. But praying about a personal problem is trust. To trust you have to know Jesus, talk to him, hear from him, know how he works, how he answers, why he answers prayer.

Are we on the way but just don't know Jesus?

Do we know Jesus but not well enough to trust him?

Remember: we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. (Rom 8:28).

LET US THINK! – God is the original thinker

The mind is incredible. Computers etc are amazing, but the mind that invented them, the programme writers and engineers...it all blows my mind. Yet God is the original Thinker - "Who has known the mind of the Lord?" Creation, macrocosmic and microcosmic (outer space and inner space) tells the astounding wonder of the divine mind. "Come", says God, "let's think this through together." Such an invite is credible only because God made us in His image, a thinking image for He is the eternal Thinker.

As a Christian you don't have to throw your mind overboard in order to please God. He calls us to worship Him with all our mind. Believing in God isn't thoughtless, it's thoughtful. Faith isn't blind trust, it involves assessing evidence, looking at God's word and seeing it to be sufficient and reliable. The idea behind, "Don't think, just believe", is quite wrong. The epistles of the New Testament are addressed to our understanding. If we remove our minds, if we don't think, we'll miss all the astonishing glories of Romans 5 and 8, of Ephesians 1 & 2 and Hebrews - to name a few.

Far too many charismatic preachers are telling us that the mind is a problem. "Forget here" they say, tapping their heads, "you need to get it here", clasping their hearts. The message is clear; there's no place for the mind, for thought in the Christian life. Well that just isn't true. God gave us our minds and He will address them, inform them and renew them.

In Romans 12:1 Paul gives a primary place to the understanding when he 6 says we are to be "transformed by the renewing of our minds". The importance given to the thought life in Scripture is very high. The battleground for credible spirituality in this present age is the mind. There is a historic aspect to our salvation, we have been saved; there is a future aspect to our salvation, we will be saved. But there is also the present aspect - we are being saved.

In this present aspect, the here and now aspect, it's a matter of the mind. Our spirits have been quickened, we've been born again. Our bodies are to be redeemed in the future, we'll be transformed and changed, but now, at this time, it's our minds that are being saved, we're undergoing the redemption of the intellect, and our present transformation (salvation) is in direct proportion to how much we're prepared to submit to this divine process. The battle now is for the mind.

This being true, attacks on thinking and using the mind must be viewed with caution. Both the misuse and the abuse of the mind are serious. It's in this light that we should consider the devil's constant attack on the mind. Because Christ is the light (understanding) of the world the devil will do everything possible to close the mind and prevent understanding.

The truth is, "the eyes of the heart" must be illuminated by the Spirit (Ephesians 1:18) so the heart can see, reason and understand. Perception and reception of truth involves our understanding, then any denigration of the mind must be regarded with caution, particularly if it is by the renewing of the mind with such truth that our lives are transformed.

Hosea = the faithful husband forever married to the backslider.


Joel = the baptizer with the Holy Ghost and fire.
